#### Attachment to CPC Project Submission Form 10/10/2019

The Sudbury portion of the Hop Brook pond system is a series of three connected ponds with a history of environmental degradation. As a result of prior phosphorus loading, uncontrolled vegetative overgrowth, and stagnation, these lakes have become highly eutrophic. However, the upstream phosphorus source is now controlled, and our most pressing concern is the compounding proliferation of invasive water chestnut. Untreated, this invasive species will effectively kill all indigenous native plants in the ponds in only a few more years. One acre of water chestnut can produce enough seeds to cover 100 acres the following year, and produces over 40 cubic yards of additional undesirable biomass each year.

We previously received a 3-year CPC grant (FY 2019 – FY 2021) to control the water chestnut through harvesting. However, like many other nearby towns, we have concluded that harvesting by itself is ineffective and impractical, and may actually spread other invasives (such as Eurasian milfoil). Further, what beneficial effect it has typically lasts no more than several weeks.

Alternately, we have found that a very effective method of controlling water chestnut is use of environmentally-friendly, rapidly-decaying chemical treatment, applied multiple times annually, in decreasing amounts over a number of years. This is being used successfully in Framingham, Wayland, Concord, Acton, and elsewhere. This treatment would be a key component of a comprehensive multi-modal pond management plan (still being developed) that could restore the ponds to class B recreational standards over time. We are seeking funding for this practical, feasible, proven approach, which *must* be initiated in 2020, or the water chestnut wins.

We can provide documentation of experience in nearby towns when we meet with you. Further, our investigations have found no effective alternatives to treatment. Other approaches (vacuuming, ultrasound) are in only experimental phases, or cannot be scaled up to meet our needs.


We only recently made the decision to take this approach, and have had very preliminary and informal discussions with the ConComm Coordinator, and a Selectperson, both of whom were supportive. We agreed with the ConComm that more thorough investigation and documentation relative to safety and effectiveness is required before they could consider approval, but they understand the dearth of alternatives and will seriously consider our request. That investigation is our primary focus at this time, and we feel confident that we will address their concerns.

We have also had initial discussions with our most likely vendor (Solitude), who was able to give us good estimates of the cost. The \$60K/year is comparable in price/acre to what we have seen in other towns. Over the years of the grant, the price per acre will rise, but the amount of required treatment should fall. We are soliciting multiple quotes.

The Hop Brook Pond system is an essential part of Sudbury's character and a valuable town asset. Without control and eventual eradication of this invasive species, 80 acres of ponds and wetlands currently used for recreation and wildlife would be turned into a stagnant and unattractive bog.

Please give our application serious consideration. We are working on this daily and will have more thorough information about safety, effectiveness, usage and experience in neighboring towns, etc., as well as our pond management plan, when we meet with you. In the meantime, please don't hesitate to contact us if you have any questions.

Note: Like the one we are requesting, the purpose of our existing grant was control and eradication of water chestnuts. However, it is not clear to us whether the prior application (attached) was written broadly enough to cover chemical treatment. If the prior grant is still usable, you may reduce our first year request in this grant by \$32K. If not, we consent to reverting the remaining funds from our prior grant, as we have no plans for further harvesting. We defer to the CPC for direction here.
