The Town of Sudbury is pleased to announce that our electricity supply program, Sudbury Community Electricity Aggregation (CEA), has been renewed! The program is designed to help our community members manage electricity supply costs and increase the use of renewable energy since 2017. You currently receive one of Sudbury's supply options. This letter explains upcoming changes to the program prices and your options.

Sudbury's new pricing takes effect starting on your December 2025 meter read.

All Sudbury CEA prices are decreasing from current contract pricing.

No action is needed to receive the new pricing.

The Sudbury CEA program launched in 2017 and has collectively saved \$9.2 million for the community, or \$1,660 per average residential customer, compared to Eversource's supply cost.

The Program has also provided cleaner electricity, sourcing voluntary renewables from National Wind sources and New England-based Class I sources. These voluntary purchases now amount to 28,230 megawatt hours (MWh) annually, avoiding over 20 million pounds of carbon pollution each year.

### SUDBURY'S SUPPLY OPTIONS

The Town is pleased to have secured lower rates for all Sudbury CEA supply options until December 2029. Sudbury CEA's default option, Sudbury Standard, will <u>cost less</u> than Eversource's Basic Service residential supply when the new prices go into effect.

### All new Sudbury CEA supply prices will be fixed for 48 months, from December 2025 until December 2029 meter reads.

# **SUDBURY PLUS** (Option)

The Eversource Basic Service residential price is 14.884 ¢/kilowatt-hour (kWh) from August 1, 2025 – January 31, 2026, and contains the minimum amount of renewable energy required by the State. Because Eversource prices change frequently and future rates are unknown, future savings cannot be guaranteed.

- No action is necessary to receive the new pricing for your current Sudbury supply option.
- You may switch to another Sudbury supply option at any time OR leave the program at any time, without penalty and return to Basic Service with Eversource. - Program prices apply to service beginning and ending on the days of the month that your meter is read.
- Program prices only apply to the Supply portion of your electric bill. Eversource will continue to set the Delivery charges on your electric bill.
- At the end of the pricing term in December 2029, you will be automatically renewed in your current supply
  option, which may have a higher or lower price and a different percentage of voluntary renewable energy as
  negotiated by the Town. The Town will announce price changes before any such change takes effect. Supply
  option details will always be available on the Town's website for the program: <u>Sudbury-CEA.com</u>.
- The State requires all electricity products to include a minimum amount of renewable energy. The Town voluntarily adds more National Wind renewable energy to Sudbury Standard and MA Class I renewable energy to Sudbury Plus. Class I renewables come from new sources located within, or delivered to, New England, and were built after 1997. Wind, solar, and low-impact hydropower are some of the most common sources that qualify for Class I. #### **NEXT STEPS**

- The first bill to show the new pricing will be the bill you receive showing usage from your December 2025 to January 2026 meter read. Most customers can expect to receive this bill in January 2026.
- <u>Tax-exempt small business</u> customers participating in the program must provide a copy of their tax-exemption certificate directly to Dynegy via email at <u>Salestax\_geotax@vistraenergy.com</u> or mail to Dynegy, ATTN: Customer Care, P.O. Box 650764, Dallas, TX 75264 to maintain tax-exempt status.
- If you recently signed up to receive your electricity supply from a competitive supplier (i.e. not Eversource or Sudbury CEA supply), you may have signed up after this letter was created. To continue to receive your electricity from that competitive supplier and prevent any possible early termination fees, please contact Sudbury CEA's supplier to check on your status in the program.
