Influenza ("flu") is a contagious disease that spreads around the United States every year, usually between October and May. Flu is caused by influenza viruses, and is spread mainly by coughing, sneezing, and close contact.

Anyone can get flu. Flu strikes suddenly and can last several days. Symptoms vary by age, but can include: fever/chills

sore throat

muscle aches

fatigue

cough

headache

runny or stuffy nose

Flu vaccine can:

- 1. Prevent you from getting flu.
- 2. Make flu less severe if you do get it.
- 3. Keep you from spreading flu to your family and friends.
