This collaboration encouraged reading for all ages, while helping our neighbors in need.

In recent years, the Foundation has funded the successful renovation of the second floor including the new Technology Center and the Sara Sherman NOW Lab makerspace. Additionally, we completely overhauled the Children’s Room and the Community Gathering Space on the first floor. These renovations have been key elements in maintaining Goodnow's excellence.

We at the Foundation are excited about our next project: the renovation and opening of the Library’s Historical Room as a quiet space for reading, writing, and studying, as well as the preservation of its important archival material. We will also continue to build our “Fund for the Future,” a designated fund to support the Library in perpetuity.

2019 was another great year of partnering with the Goodnow Library Foundation! The GLF's financial and logistical support is crucial for the Library achieving its vision and goals of being a valued community partner and proactive and responsive to community needs. The partnerships we develop build relationships and trust with the community in a way neither of us could do individually.

This year we were proud to co-host the first ever “Sudbury Doing Good Community Info Fair,” with close to 50 local non-profits and local organizations participating, and almost 200 attendees. In April, the GLF held a two day indoor mini-golf fundraiser for all ages – the Goodnow Open. In addition, the Be Bold speaker series brought in and engaged new audiences. The internship program, Goodnow Develops, allowed us to work specifically with teens in a way that mutually benefits both parties; they learn invaluable leadership and community development skills, while we are able to offer unique programming for families. As a result of these efforts, more people than ever are engaged with and value the Library.

The other major project the Library and Foundation has been focused on this year is the final phase of a multi-year effort to “Reimagine the Second Floor.” This final phase seeks to raise money to update the Historical Room so that it serves the needs of 21st-century patrons while maintaining its characteristic 19th-century aesthetic. During the Library’s strategic planning, we learned that the community craved more quiet work space. The Library’s Historic Room is under-utilized because it houses the Library’s special historic collections and remains locked most of the time. If it could be updated so that the collections were secured, the beautiful and inspirational space could be opened to the public whenever the Library is open. Library staff, in partnership with the GLF, put together proposals for Capital Preservation Funds in addition to other fundraising to realize this vision. While the pandemic has slowed this project's progress, we are still moving forward!

The close partnership the Library shares with the GLF is rewarding and fruitful. With its wonderful staff and board members – who are supportive, engaged, and helpful – there is no limit to what the Library can accomplish.

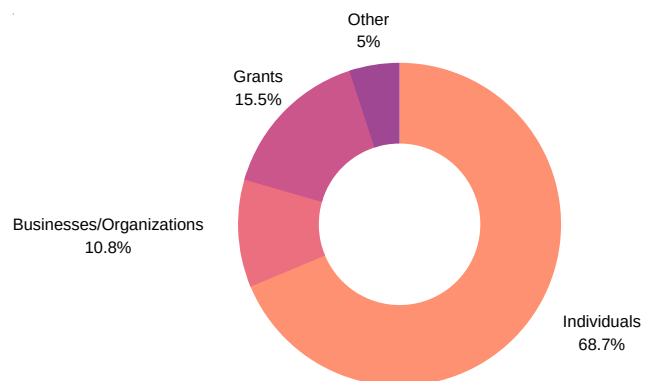

Tribute to GLF Co-Founder Barbara Pryor GLF Board 2008-2019

The Goodnow Library would not be what it is today without the vision and dedicated work of Barbara Pryor. Barbara was a co-founder of the Foundation in 2008 and subsequently served on its Board for 12 years, while also serving as an elected member of the Library's Board of Trustees since 2003. Most importantly, Barbara has been an active fundraiser, and with her calm and diplomatic manner she has steered the Foundation to bring the extra margin of excellence to Goodnow.

When I think of what the Goodnow Library Foundation has accomplished in the last 12 years, I am thrilled to have been a part of this organization. Working with a knowledgeable Library staff under the direction of excellent Library directors, the Foundation raises the funds to provide innovative capital improvements that will continue to transform Goodnow as a welcoming place for the varied interests of our Sudbury community.

TREE OF INSPIRATION

Renowned artist and Sudbury resident Janice Corkin Rudolf has created a three-foot bronze sculpture to be placed at the entrance of the Sara Sherman NOW Lab. Donated by Rudolf and the Robert Lloyd Corkin Foundation, "Tree of Inspiration" depicts three children, and Rudolf has beautifully integrated hand-painted tiles into the base of the sculpture, each purchased and painted by members of the community as a way to recognize one's family or honor a special person. **This creative initiative raised just over \$20,000 for the renovation.** *{The sculpture's March 2020 installation has been postponed due to the coronavirus pandemic.}*



Engaging the Community



GOODNOW OPEN

The GLF's annual gala – our largest fundraising event of the year – is a highlight for our Library community. In 2019, we hosted the “Goodnow Open” and transformed the Library into a miniature golf course. The GLF was delighted by the support of local families, businesses, and associations that sponsored the event, highlighting Sudbury's dedication to and support of Goodnow. More than 200 guests socialized with friends, all while getting in a round or two of golf! The Foundation also hosted a mini golf Family Day the following morning.

COMMUNITY INFO FAIR

In September, the GLF partnered with "Sudbury Doing Good" – the informal affinity group organized by the Sudbury Foundation – to host the first-ever Sudbury Doing Good Community Info Fair. 46 local nonprofits and community organizations set up booths in the Library as close to 200 people visited to learn more about Sudbury's efforts and "doing good."



BE BOLD SPEAKER SERIES

After a successful pilot program in September 2017, the Goodnow Library Foundation continued its popular "Be Bold" speaker series. These evenings are designed to educate and connect the impressive members of our community through sharing viewpoints and discussion. The GLF hosted four Be Bold Events in 2019 – all with a casual, public-run format encouraging community members to ask questions and lead conversations.



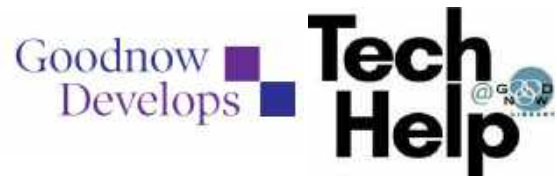
GOODNOW DEVELOPS

Thanks to the Sudbury Foundation and Main Street Bank, in 2019 we formalized our high school internship program and initiated “Goodnow Develops,” a community leadership program. Our “developers” work in the Foundation office to learn about the daily operations and inner-workings of a nonprofit. Throughout 2019, they partnered with staff and senior volunteers to assist with mailings, database work, event planning, and social media support. In addition to hands-on work in the Sara Sherman NOW Lab helping Goodnow’s Teen Librarian to prepare for activities and classes using the makerspace, our interns created a TechHelp event designed to teach seniors the ins and outs of newer technology. We are grateful for these local grants that allow young people the opportunity to develop skills, training, and awareness to become philanthropic donors and activists in their community.

LOIS LOWRY

In April 2019, the Goodnow Library Foundation partnered with Gifts of Hope Unlimited, a local nonprofit that assists individuals and families impacted by relationship violence. Together, we welcomed award-winning author Lois Lowry to give a talk about her books, which attracted 65 attendees. Thanks to the Concord Bookshop, attendees were able to purchase Lowry’s work and meet her as she signed books. Lowry has written more than 30 children’s books and was awarded the Newbery Medal for both *Number the Stars* (1990) and *The Giver* (1994). This event demonstrated the GLF’s commitment to engaging with and uniting with other local nonprofits in order to strengthen Sudbury.
