Snapshot Economic Resilience

Predominantly residential tax base, but over 7,000 jobs

□ Taxes:

93% of assessed value is residential.

91% of tax levy is residential.

□ Jobs:


Largest sectors by employment

Health Care, Professional Services, Government (public schools), Retail Trade

Driving job growth

Health Care (including day care and elder care), Professional Services

- Mismatch between resident skills and employment opportunities
 - Median earnings for jobs:
 \$44,300
 - Median earnings of residents: \$81,609
 - → 90% out-commuting
 - → 88% in-commuting
- ☐ Employment clustered along Route 20/Boston Post Road corridor and in schools


