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2007-2012 Open Space and Recreation Plan

Goals and Objectives

Goal: Preserve town character though the permanent protection of undeveloped land, surface water bodies and wetlands, agricultural lands and uses, publicly important viewscapes and historic sites.

- Work with landowners, non-profit organizations and local farmers for preservation
- Zoning incentives to preserve open space. Not rezoning

Goal: Protect land areas and migration corridors for the preservation and continued viability of indigenous flora and fauna.

- Inventory parcels to identify sensitive areas
- Work with landowners to obtain conservation restrictions
- Encourage land stewardship in critical areas

Goal: Protect the quality and quantity of the Town's water supply, through aquifer and groundwater protection and water use education.

- Investigate sewer options for Route 20 businesses
- National Pollution Discharge Effluent Standards (NPDES) Phase 2 compliance
- Sudbury Water District conservation, education, land protection
- Board of Health Title V
- Encourage LID and LEEDS construction for stormwater
- Monitor nitrogen loading from developments

Goal: Protect and restore the quality of the Town's ponds and waterways.

- Reduce Marlboro Easterly Treatment Plant emissions
- Sudbury River parcels
- Ponds and Waterways Committee recommendations

Goal: Provide and maintain a diversity of conservation and recreation land uses reflecting the interests and needs of the whole community, including opportunities for both active and passive recreation.

- 2004 Athletic Field Master Plan
- Town lands, including the landfill, Melone property and Mahoney property.
- Eco-tourism
- Community Preservation Act and other funding sources

Goal: Develop and maintain trail linkages by connecting old or creating new walkways and trails for non-motorized recreation.

Goal: Continue to provide outreach to increase awareness among residents of the range of the Town's open space and recreational assets.
