Site Observations:

- F&O visited the project site and walked the length of the project.
- Groups on site:
 - A.A Will Corporation
 - Stanley Tree Service
- The following observations were made:

General Notes

- 1. Rail has been removed along the entire length of the corridor except for from approximately Sta. 320+50 to 330+00.
- 2. Rail ties have not been removed in any locations.

Between Sta 101+00 and 116+00 (Project start to Codjer Lane)

- 1. During the visit, workers and trucks from Stanley Tree Service were chipping low brush, sticks and logs at approximately Sta. 108+00 and were continuing the clearing northward (See Photo 1).
- 2. Rail spikes have been removed.

Between Sta 116+00 and 143+00 (Codjer Lane to Old Lancaster Road)

- 1. Low brush as well as some larger trees have been cleared.
- 2. A stone pile has been placed along Old Lancaster Road at approximately Sta. 143+00.
- 3. Workers were placing the stone around the Hop Brook bridge. (See Photo 2)

Between Sta 143+00 and 175+00 (Old Lancaster Road to Hudson Road)

- 1. Steel has been placed over the stream at Sta. 167+20 (See Photo 3)
- 2. Stone has been laid at approximately Sta. 175+00
- 3. Rail has been stacked at approximately Sta. 175+00 (See Photo 4)



Between Sta. 175+00 and 215+80 (Hudson Road to Morse Road)

- 1. Construction fencing has been placed North of Hudson Road between the proposed path location and the historic rail that is to be retained.
- 2. Clearing of low brush and larger trees was apparent in this area (See Photo 5).

Between Sta. 215+80 and 275+00 (Morse Road to Haynes Road)

- 1. The future parking lot entrance at approximately Sta. 215+80 appears to have been partially cleared (See Photo 6).
- 2. Rail has been stacked at approximately Sta. 216+00.
- 3. The deck of the bridge across Pantry Brook has been fully removed and the area surrounding the brook has been fenced off (See Photo 7).
- 4. Rail and rail spikes have been stacked at approximately Sta. 274+60 (See Photo 8)

Between Sta. 275+00 and 284+50 (Haynes Road to Pantry Road)

1. A crew was picking up railroad spikes and other miscellaneous scrap metal throughout this area.

Between Sta. 284+50 and 335+00 (Pantry Road to Project End)

- 1. Dumpsters were placed at approximately Stations 307+00 and 308+00 and contained railroad spikes.
- 2. Rail was stacked at approximately Sta. 307+00 (See Photo 9).
- 3. A crew was removing and stacking rail at approximately Sta. 320+50 (See Photo 10).
- 4. The remainder of the rail was expected to be removed by 4/3/2023.
