## Fairbank Update June 2023

Since then the contractor has been working to enclose the building and begin work on the inside, which is in various stages of completion. 


The whole center, with the gym and Park and Rec on the left, SPS and Senior Center on the right, and shared spaces and an outdoor "Commons" lawn in the center.






Painting is ongoing in the Senior Center (left) and complete in the SPS offices (right)




New openings in the pool wall for doors to new locker rooms....






And new gutters along the pool edge!

Large interior windows will allow views into the gym and daylight to spill into the corridors. The existing pool windows are directly across from the gym windows.

Insulated walls in a Park and Rec program room.



A curved wall lines the main corridor in Park and Rec, with a dedicated toddler/preschool program room on the other side of the wall. This is located at the transition point from the Park and Rec corridor into the shared use space ahead and the corridor leading to the locker rooms to the left.
