

Fairbank Community Center website update

When last reported in February, the **Pool Viewing Room** looked like this:



and now looks like this!



With the construction largely completed on Phase 2, the Pool Viewing Room, the Aquatics Office, Park and Recreation Lobby/Reception, and site amenities are complete. The signed Certificate of Substantial Completion was just issued to the contractor this week, though the Temporary Certificate of Occupancy was issued at the end of May. Summer camp was held on site, while close-out and punch list work continued.

Some scope was added during Phase 2 in order to improve the functioning of the building and grounds: exterior door hardware on all doors to improve indoor/outdoor program connectivity, an intercom at the SPS entry for security, connecting walkways encircling the building for ease of grounds maintenance, and drainage infrastructure that will tie in with the larger drainage project on the Fairbank Road side of the site.

The drainage project will soon be underway. Remaining work on the project includes the hanging of the "barn door" cover of the roll-up gym door on the Commons lawn, some landscape elements, resolving an acoustics issue, and completing the installation of AV equipment. Pool upgrades and repairs are in the design phase of a separate project.

It's been a long wait, but the new Community Center is finally here. There is much to be proud of - the combined center offers residents of all ages the opportunity to play games in a full-sized gym or outdoor court (lit at night), attend Senior Center events (or just hang out), attend after-school programs or adult art and fitness classes, meet with Sudbury Public Schools staff, and go for a swim. 


Park and Recreation two-story lobby. The Aquatics Office is behind the glass wall. The Pool Viewing Room is through the open area to the right of the doors.

New doors bring light into the Pool Viewing Room and offer a view outside from the pool. This room was once the brick-walled pool viewing area/reception/lobby at the old building.




The new doors provide an indoor/outdoor connection for programmed activities.
