With another wonderful 'summer as it should be' already in the rearview mirror, our year round team is back at work planning off season events and work around property and preparing for the summer of 2024.

HOPE Sudbury hosted their annual fishing derby at the fishing pond in August, and as always we were thrilled to partner with them in this important fundraising endeavor. We are also proud to once again be a banana box staging area for the Sudbury Community Food Pantry.

It is hard to believe that our annual fall event for Sudbury residents is right around the corner. We plan to repeat last year's Trunk or Treat and Craft fair, with a tentative date of Sunday, October 22 10am-12pm. Our goal is to finalize the date and begin to publicize the event within the next two weeks. We are looking forward to once again welcoming residents on property for some Fall Fun!

Work is nearly complete on the accessibility improvements at Liberty Lodge. Sudbury Combined Facilities Director Sandra Duran has been working very closely with us and the Engineer and Contractor for the job, and we are looking forward to meeting with her on site at the end of this week to review the work that has been completed so far. We are also scheduled to begin work on the pond accessibility project in early October.

Enrollment opens for the summer of 2024 (our 65th year!) next week, so our year round staff has been busy making a few programming updates and preparing applications to go live. Our Sudbury resident scholarship application will also be available at that time. The biggest programming change is that we are reimagining our preschool program, and folding our half day Sprouts and full day Saplings groups into one Junior Camp section. We believe that this change will greatly benefit our youngest campers, allowing them to move at their own pace while still experiencing all of the magic of Sewataro.
