Ambulance 255 is a meticulously restored 1916 Model T Ford American Field Service ambulance. It serves as a tangible reminder of the 2500 American volunteers who drove these vehicles before the United States entered the Great War one hundred years ago. George King of N. Franklin CT and Jeff Klinger of Sudbury will be on-hand to answer questions and provide additional commentary. George and Jeff have taken 255 around the Eastern US and to Europe, participating in President Obama's inaugural parade, ceremonies at Arlington National Cemetery, and presentations to students, historical societies and civic and veteran's organizations. Whether an interested citizen, a history sleuth, an old car buff, or simply curious, don't miss this opportunity to be part of "living history." Especially welcome are "students of any age."

The Parade starts at 9:30AM at the Rugged Bear Plaza, and ends at the WWI Memorial, near Town Hall. At the conclusion of the parade (c1130) we hope you can stop-by and see Ambulance 255.
